



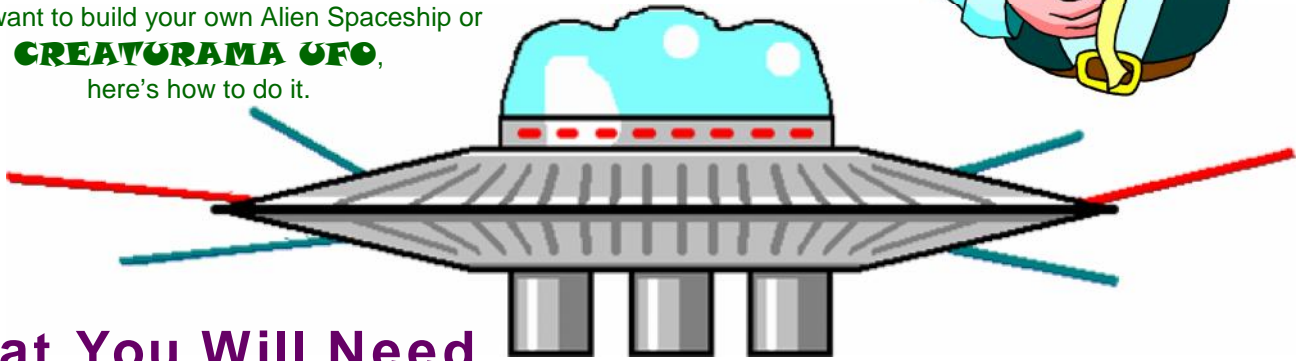
HOW TO MAKE CREATURAMA UNIVERSE

Artist Anthony James creates his amazing costumes and models by using recycled materials.



UFO

If you want to build your own Alien Spaceship or **CREATURAMA UFO**, here's how to do it.



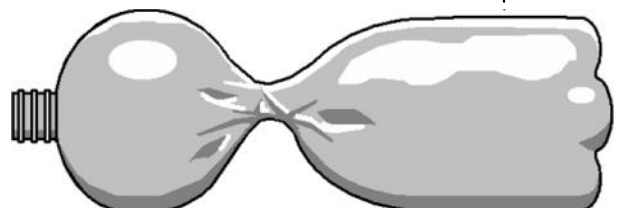
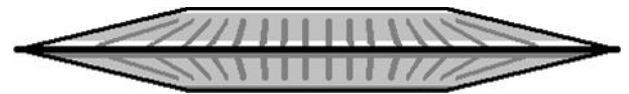
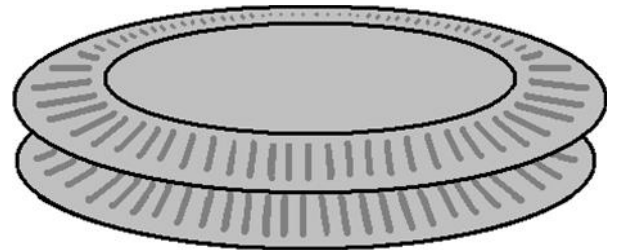
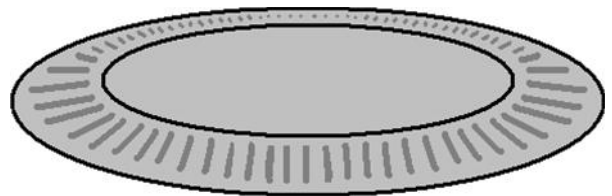
What You Will Need

**A Roll of WIDE Masking Tape. Scissors
A Large Paper Plates. 6 Plastic Straws.
1 large 2Lt Plastic Pop Bottle. Scrap-
paper. 2 toilet rolls. Felt Tip Pens.
Water based (ready mixed) paint.
Some Brushes.**

STEP 1 The Saucer.

This is a very simple make. Join two Paper plates together one on top of the other with the top plate upside down. Stick these together with small bits of tape around the edges. To ensure they stay apart when you press the top dome onto the saucer the plates will create you can half a toilet roll cardboard tube inside before you fix the plates together, this will keep them in shape.

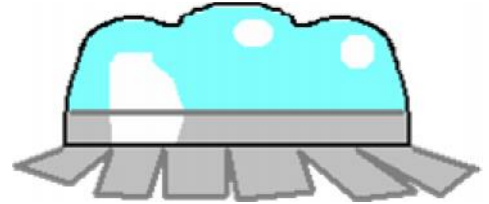
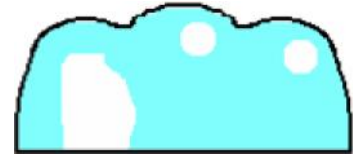
Once the two plates are firmly attached cut the bottom off a 2Lt pop bottle, again there are options here with colour i.e. green, silver or blue bottles etc. I prefer to use transparent as you will see on the next sheet. To cut a plastic bottle safely squash the bottle and cut a snip where the plastic is creased.



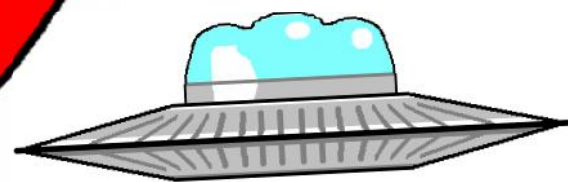

STEP 2. The Cockpit.

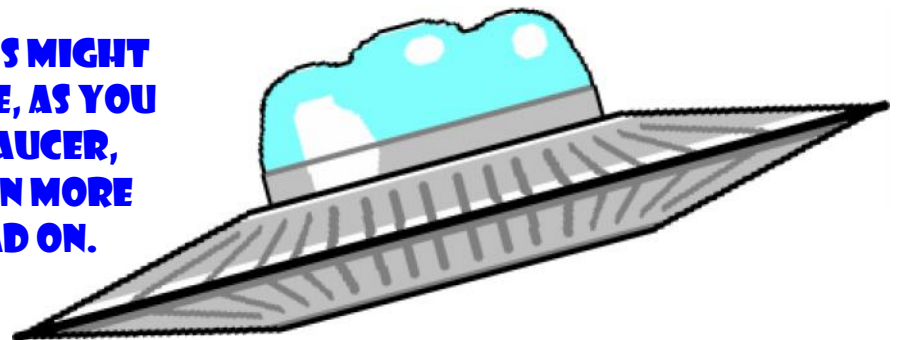
Now you have the bottom of the bottle you can draw around this on a scrap piece of paper to create the 'Cockpit' where your alien pilot is going to sit. Or if you want you can cut out the supplied picture from this sheet. You stick this with a piece of double sided tape to the side you have decided is the top of your UFO. Then stick some tape half on and half off the bottom of the bottle and then cut slits into the tape so they can be bent up and the cockpit attached over the top of the picture. This will create a transparent Cockpit with an alien sitting in your UFO.

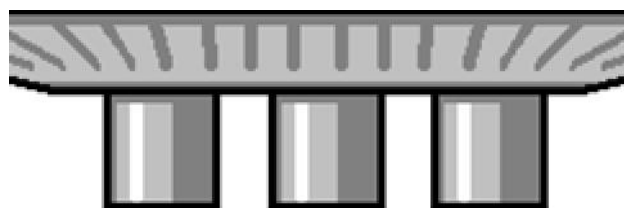
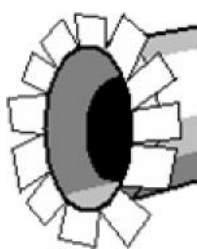
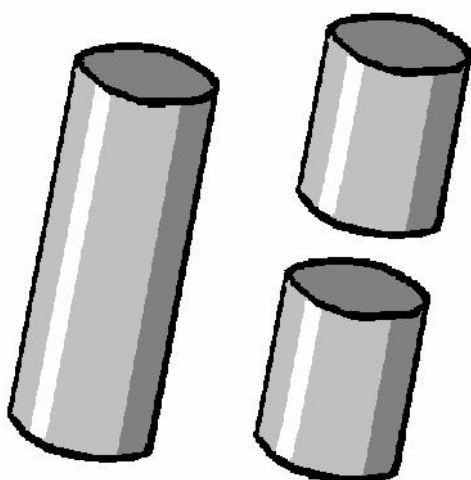
STEP 3

Coloured plastic straws can now be added around the UFO's circumference with small pieces of tape. Add around six of these and attach them to the top of the UFO's edge.



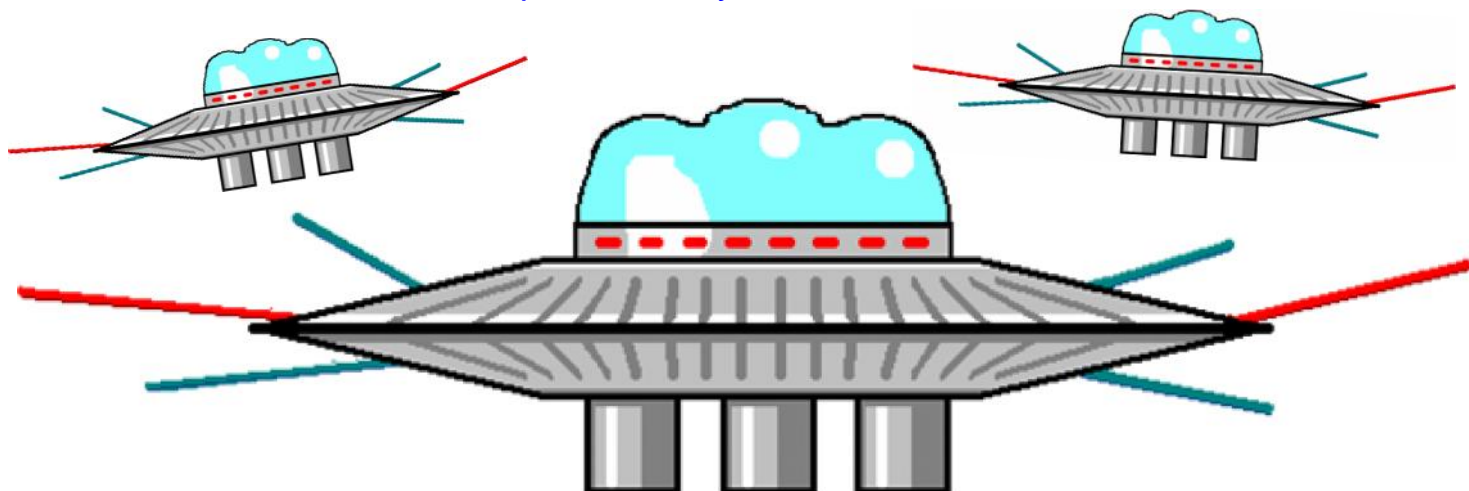
STEP 4 Landing Legs.

To create landing legs you will need two toilet rolls. Simply flatten these and cut each one in half. You should now have four small legs, or engines if you prefer. Attach these to the underside of your UFO by sticking some tape half on and half off the top of each roll, then cut slits into the tape and fold it back ready to stick onto the model.



STEP 5 Painting.

Right, it's up to you what colour you choose to paint your UFO. If you have silver paint then that's great as they really look good silver. Remember don't paint the plastic Cockpit otherwise you won't see the alien pilot inside, or the straws. Just paint the paper plates. When the paint is dry you can use felt tip pens to colour in shapes and patterns on your UFO.
